NCNMU Scholarship Application Criteria

- 1. Academic Achievement: Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in their undergraduate studies, with a focus on relevant coursework in biology, anatomy, or related fields.
- 2. **Financial Need**: Scholarships will be awarded based on demonstrated financial need, as determined by the FAFSA or equivalent financial aid application.
- 3. **Commitment to Naprapathic Science**: Applicants should submit a personal statement outlining their passion for Naprapathic Science, including any relevant experiences or volunteer work in the field.
- 4. Leadership and Extracurricular Involvement: Preference will be given to applicants who have demonstrated leadership skills and active involvement in healthcare-related clubs, volunteer organizations, or community service projects.
- 5. **Diversity and Inclusion**: We encourage applications from individuals from diverse backgrounds, including underrepresented minorities, LGBTQ+ individuals, and those with disabilities.
- 6. **Professional Goals**: Applicants should articulate their career goals in the field of Naprapathic Science and how they plan to contribute to the advancement of the profession.
- 7. Letters of Recommendation: Applicants must submit two letters of recommendation from educators, mentors, or professionals who can attest to their academic abilities, character, and suitability for the scholarship.
- 8. **Personal Statement/Essay**: In their personal statement, applicants should discuss their motivation for pursuing Naprapathic Science, any challenges they have overcome, and how they envision using their education to make a positive impact in the field.
- 9. **Current Applicant of NCNM University**: Applicants must be current applicants of NCNM University and have submitted a complete application packet for admission to one of the Naprapathic Science programs, including Prenaprapathy, Doctor of Naprapathy, or Naprapathic Assistant.
- 10. **Membership to the American Naprapathic Association**: Applicants must show current student membership to the American Naprapathic Association as part of their application.
- 11. **Interview (Optional)**: Shortlisted candidates may be invited to participate in an interview to further assess their suitability for the scholarship and their alignment with the program's values.
- 12. **Ethical Standards**: Applicants must agree to abide by ethical standards in their academic and professional conduct, as outlined by the NCNM University Code of Ethics.
